
Giving

A second example of leadership is to "walk the walk." I cannot preach about tithing without tithing. Traditionally tithing has meant giving 10% of income to the church. I am pledging to tithe my salary each month. I'm not tithing what is left over after taxes or after my bills have been paid. I am tithing my salary, no exceptions, no weasel words. I begin with tithing and then pay my bills.

I am aware there are many questions swirling around the finances of the country which can have a direct impact upon our individual finances as well as the church's. I cannot control the financial decisions made

Spiritual Disciplines

During the months of May and June I invite you to take time each week to practice a spiritual discipline which is found in the scripture reading for that Sunday.

Spiritual disciplines are many and varied. Some are famous and practiced by many such as Prayer. Some are not often recognized as a discipline such as Celebration and Silence. Some disciplines come easy for us while that same discipline, for others, is difficult. Some disciplines are practiced in the comfortable surroundings of our homes while others may be practiced in the openness of the outdoors accompanied by creepy crawly things, singing birds, and God forbid, spiders.


I recommend these readings for you for the listed weeks. Spend some time with them each day and listen for God in each selection. If you feel totally lost and never hear or feel God's presence, take heart you are beginning a practice. No one is good at a discipline when first beginning. Think back to how hard it was to first tie your shoes. How many tries did it take you before you had one success? After several more tries and fails you were able to do it without a parent watching over you. Even then you weren't accomplished. Remember the shoe laces coming untied as you walked to school? It took many tries before you were good at the task. The same is true for spiritual disciplines. Each takes practice before you might see a breakthrough. An example; try the discipline of silence. Find a comfy chair, a quiet room and sit in silence with only your thoughts to accompany you. Most people, after 10 minutes or so, are fast asleep! Practice allows you to see results (and stay awake!)

The readings and practices below are from my selected Sunday readings for the next two months (all are subject to change!). I will be preaching from these passages and probably highlighting the listed discipline. (*Continued on p. 6*)


Fidgets and Toys for Young Children
