On Easter Sunday I entered the sanctuary before anyone else had arrived at the church. The sunrise sparkled golden through the old and beautiful stained glass windows. In a couple of hours the pews would be filled with our members and friends. But for that moment it was just the awak-

ening sun and me. I loved how the pews lit up and the light sang “Alleluia” as it brightened the room.

Resurrection is the work of something new “breaking” into the world. The word denotes an uprising, like tectonic plates colliding and lifting up the ground underneath our feet. A resurrection changes the landscape and shifts the way we need to look at the world.

A resurrection is both a reorientation to the world, and a welcoming of new life. I drew in a breath in the sanctuary as I looked at the windows, thanking God for this new experience, this new day, this new Easter. During the worship service hours later with Easter flowers, brass ensemble, and singing and children, I sat among the children and told them to share their “Alleluias” with a burst of joy, with excitement, with a sense of resurrection. They unburied their Alleluia banners and shouted with spirit, “Alleluia!” That moment was both a change in the landscape and a sign of new life!

Hello again dear friends! I think Spring is about to commit to our calendars, and to our patient waiting for more than a tease now and then.

Spring is finally springing! Alleluia!

I want to update everyone with our One Great Hour of Sharing collection. So far we have collected \$908! If anyone didn't have a chance to add to this great cause, you can still write a check to church with OGHS on the memo line, and it will get to where it belongs. One Great Hour began with a few churches in the U.S. wanting to help with Europe's restoration after WWII. This was a huge challenge, Europe was just shredded, much bombed into dust...This idea of churches sending help in many forms began as a tiny seed, and has over the years produced a heavy crop. Where disaster hits, our churches still try to fill the gap, to get survivors on their feet and moving forward again. THANK YOU ALL for your desire to help those who have been overcome and need a hand up.

We also have some fun summertime projects that our young ones can help with: First, we have just heard the Heifer Project will for a short time triple the money sent in for purchasing baby animals!! This is where our piggy banks come in! The children pick the village or town where they want to send the (?) babies (with the help of Sunday school teachers), what kind of babies, chickens for eggs, or a real baby goat, or baby cow to give milk when it grows up, or fish for their pond, animals that they can shear the wool from for clothes...these helpful creatures can make life much better for people living in a poor area. And even though you have never met these people, you can imagine how getting baby animals will make them smile. Bring your BANKS in on May 15, so Pastor can bless them, we can count the coins to find out WHAT, and how many animals we can send WHERE? We will try to get it all done by May 22 (Children's Sunday).

We are also planning to plant a Children's garden for the Food Pantry, so we can give people fresh produce, right out of our little garden here at Church.

Our refugee family in Oshkosh is doing very well. Dad and his oldest son have jobs now, which makes them happy to be a bigger part of the community. There has been a request from the new mosque in Oshkosh at which our family attends services, for help in a need for a Koran, and prayer rugs. Outreach will be looking into helping with this project. Blessings for now.

What you need:

- Clean cardboard egg carton
- Scissors
- Acrylic paint and paintbrush
- Flat cardboard
- Photo, drawing or note
- Small pom-poms
- Hot glue
- Adult help

What you do:

1. Bend, stretch and cut the carton cups to make 3-D flower shapes. Also cut leaf shapes from the carton top.
2. Paint the flowers and leaves. Let dry.
3. Cut the flat cardboard to a size and shape you desire. Leave a border at least 2 inches larger than your photo, drawing or note.
4. With hot glue, attach the photo, drawing or note to the cardboard.
5. Arrange and glue flowers and leaves around the border. Attach pom-poms for more color and texture.
6. Present the gift to your mom or a special woman in your life.



Faith Formation

Sunday School - Countdown to Children's Sunday - We are going to wrap up our learning about the Old Testament with four stories about King David. You will see the children perform skits based on these stories during our Children's Sunday Service on Sunday, May 22nd. A light lunch will be served after the service with outdoor activities for the children.

With music, arts and crafts, games, and skits, this will be an active week that will culminate in a show for families and a picnic. 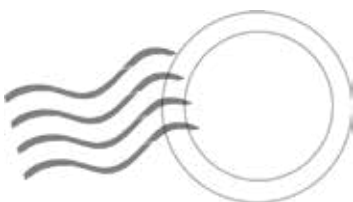
