It is never too late to change.

Recently I found a reflection written by one of my new favorite authors, Kate DiCamillo. (Actually, DiCamillo has been a long time favorite author of mine! But I have just now re-discovered her since my daughter Ainslie has brought home some of her books, like The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane, and The Magician's Elephant which was recently released as a movie.)

Kate DiCamillo recently wrote about reading Charles Dickens' A Christmas Carol, a story that is very familiar anyone who lives near Ripon. Every year Ripon celebrates

Dickens of a Christmas weekend shortly after Thanksgiving, and the entire downtown is filled with Living Windows and music inspired by A Christmas Carol, along with all the wonder and magic that comes during this time of year. It's an event that inspires the child in all of us, and one of the reasons my family loves living in Ripon!

So when I read this thought from Kate DiCamillo, I was immediately struck by the hope, and the challenge, that Dickens' A Christmas Carol offers us:

"Every year, I read Charles Dickens' A Christmas Carol, and every year, it convinces me that it is never too late to change. In the same way, I remember reading Katherine Paterson's Bridge to Terabithia for the first time,

encountering this sentence: "He felt there in the teachers' room that it was the beginning of a new season in his life, and he chose to deliberately make it so," and

feeling the promise of those words. Again and again, stories have delivered this life-saving message to me: it is ever-possible to change, to deliberately begin a new season. Thank you to all of you (teachers, librarians, booksellers, parents) who put books into the hands of readers, books that help us change, help us become our better selves.

This new year we have a lot to look forward to, and, I believe, we have a lot of hope that "it is ever-possible to change" and begin something new.

In fact, this is one of the promises of our faith: So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything

old has passed away; look, new things have come into being! (2 Corinthians 5:17)

Where are you looking to make a new start in your life in the next year?

Using the stories of our faith, we are delivered with the lifesaving and Good News that it is possible to change.

New things have come to us in Christ, says the Apostle Paul in his letter to the Corinthians. Join us in 2024 as we discover that it is never too late to make a change and make the world a better place.



#### Let's Get Started - Prayer Cloth Ministry



If it has been a while since you picked up a pair of knitting needles, if you are just getting started, or if you are an experienced knitter, our Prayer Cloth MInistry is for you.

Prayer cloths are a tangible reminder of God's love. They are also reminders that someone is thinking about you and praying with you. Prayer cloths provide a way for members of a faith community to connect with one another during times of celebration, transition, pain, or crisis.

What's a prayer cloth ministry? Simple. A group of folks make small knitted pieces (see photos) to give to people as reminders of God's love and the love of our faith community. You can make the squares on your own and join others for a knitting circle once a month to learn new skills and see what others are doing.

Our first knitting circle will take place on Monday, January 8th at 6:30 PM in the chapel.

In the meantime, if you would like to try your hand at making a prayer cloth, here's a simple pattern that will make a cloth similar to the ones in the picture. If you are interested in making larger prayer shawls, the group can move in that direction once we've gotten started with these smaller projects.

#### **Prayer Cloth Instructions**

#### What you need:

Yarn - About 25-30 yards of worsted weight yarn (You can use other weights of yarn, but the size of the cloth will vary with the size of the yarn and needles.)

Needles - Size 8, go smaller with lighter yarn, bigger with heavier yarn.

Notions - Two stitch markers, a yarn needle, (Optional) charms or beads

#### **Instructions:**

- 1. Cast on 22 stitches using long-tail cast on or your preferred cast-on technique.
- 2. Knit 4 rows. You can create a selvedge edge by slipping the first stitch of each row.
- 3. Set up row Kint 4, place marker, purl 14, place marker, knit 4. Knit 4 stitches at the beginning and end of each row to create a frame for the cross image. Steps 4-8 create the cross pattern on the center 14 stitches.
- 4. For the next 3 rows, alternate Knit 1 row, purl 1 row on the center 14 stitches.
- 5. Set up row for cross On center 14 stitches, purl 4, knit 6, purl 4.
- 6. For the next 13 rows, on center 14 stitches alternate theses rows (1) knit 4, purl 6, knit 4 and (2) purl 4, knit 6, purl 4.
- 7. Cross Bar For the next 6 rows on center 14 stitches, alternate rows of knit stitches and rows of purl stitches, ending with a purl row.
- 8. For the next 6 rows alternate rows on center stitches as in step 6 above.
- 9. Next 4 rows, alternate rows of purl and knit stitches, starting with purl.
- 10. Finishing rows, knit all stitches for the next 4 rows, removing markers.
- 11. Bind off all stitches using a simple bind off technique or your preferred technique.
- 12. Use a yarn needle to weave in ends. You can also add a tassel at one corner, a cross charm or other embellishments as you prefer.
