#### **Breeze**

"Ugh!" I said as I pried the window open in our kitchen. After a long winter and fickle spring, it was time to open the windows in the house and let in a fresh wind. The weather outside was finally cooperating, so it was time for the storm windows to get opened to air out the house and let our family enjoy the sweet Wisconsin weather this time of year (at least before the 90 degree days start up with all the humidity)!

Opening the windows, however, was not a breeze in our 1893 Queen Anne Victorian home we purchased in 2020. The ancient windows groaned and creaked as I tried to "gently" force them open. The paint on the windows in some places needed a

razor blade to separate wood from wood. Time had sealed up the windows such that they declined to cooperate. They were not very forgiving.

I huffed and I puffed and tried to push the kitchen window open without breaking the glass. At last (after I uttered some encouragement to the window, which I cannot repeat here) the window relented and rose a few inches before becoming stuck again. I pushed and nudged the window again. A couple of more inches. Repeat. Finally I got the window open. But the character of the window was such that if I let go, the whole window pane would come crashing down, probably sealing itself shut again. With this consequence in mind, I bore the weight of the old heavy window as I reached for the wooden dowel we use to prop it open, and wedged it in place.

"Ah! The fresh breeze!" I exclaimed as sweat poured down my forehead. It felt good to enjoy the fruits of my late spring labor.



### The Spirit

Jesus tells us that the Spirit is fickle. It is like the wind that blows wherever it may, and where it goes, no one knows. We can hear it, experience it, feel its breeze on our face com-

ing in through the window. But we do not know where it comes from or where it goes. The Spirit is full of mystery, and it surprises us. So too, Jesus says, are those born of the spirit. They go to new places. Try new things. Show up unexpectedly, or maybe just when we need them.

The Holy Spirit, it seems, is out there doing its thing, just like the wind, but it takes some work to notice it, or to know what you're looking for. Jesus puts it this way: To see the divine in the world, you must open yourself to the divine. To be "born" of it. Instead of solely seeing our lives in terms of what we own (or don't) and how successful we have been (or not),

Jesus wants us to not focus on the perfect lawfulness of our lives, but on the playful gentleness of love and grace. When we conform to this world, as Nicodemus has done, we can do everything "right" and still feel lost. Jesus says the answer is not what we have built (such as a Victorian house, a successful business, a comfy retirement), but what God has built (God's kingdom, love, justice, kindness).

There is a whole divine world out there, like the sweet summertime breeze wisping away through the trees. But if we are stuck up inside the perfect lives we've built, there's no way for us to feel the Spirit move. We need to open a window.

The windows of our hearts, however, can sometimes be stuck and unrelenting, like the antique windows of a Victorian home. Opening them to let the wind in is not impossible, like Nicodemus thought. The windows of our hearts need to be coaxed and nudged, in just the right way, to allow for God's fresh Spirit to blow into our lives, and delight us.
