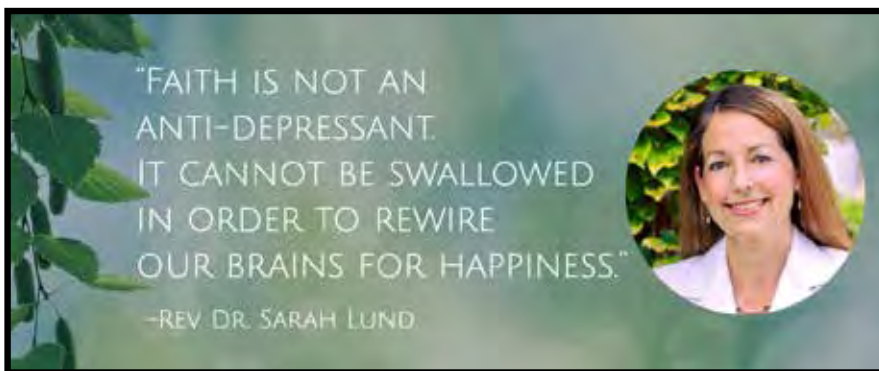

“A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another.” — John 13:34

The church can be a major resource for people navigating mental health issues. However we should not substitute going to church with getting medical help for mental illness. Rev. Lund said, “Faith is not an anti-depressant. It cannot be swallowed in order to rewire our brains for happiness.” Rather our faith communities can act as support systems in the midst of receiving good health care for our minds from professionals. The church and medical professionals can work together to address mental health issues in our community.



As your pastor, I attended the Wisconsin Conference UCC Annual Meeting, June 10-12, 2022 at the Green Lake Conference Center. This year’s theme was “Building up the Beloved Community.” Recognizing the toll that the pandemic has taken on congregations, pastors and lay leaders, the meeting focused on tending to both individual and congregational wellness, lifting up best practices and good strategies for fostering healthy church dynamics and challenging our leaders to think in fresh ways about the Church. It was a beautiful three days of worship, workshops, business, and plenary sessions. We had several wonderful guest speakers, as well as presentations from conference staff and ministry leaders.

I especially enjoyed the keynote presentation by Rev. Dr. Sarah Lund. She spoke about Good Enough Love. She reminded us that only God’s love is perfect. Yet, sometimes we put too much pressure on ourselves and others to be perfect. What if there is another way, a “good enough” way, to love? By focusing on building beloved communities of good enough love, we make space for everyone to belong, including our imperfect selves.

Rev. Sarah Lund’s mission is to partner with others to share hope and healing. She serves as Minister for Disabilities and Mental Health Justice on the national staff of the UCC and as senior pastor of First Congregational UCC of Indianapolis, IN. In January of 2022, Sarah joined the US Department of Health and Human Services national Think Tank about faith communities and youth mental health. Sarah is the author of several books about mental health: *Blessed are the Crazy: Breaking the Silence About Mental Illness, Family, and Church* (2014), *Blessed Union: Breaking the Silence About Mental Illness and Marriage* (2021), and *Blessed Youth: Breaking the Silence About Mental Illness with Children and Teens* (2022), and a pocket-sized book for youth: *Blessed Youth Survival Guide* (2022). Sarah blogs at www.sarahgriffithlund.com.

I have copies of all of Rev. Lund’s books if you would like to read one of them. Her keynote address laid the groundwork for why our conference and our churches need to talk about Mental Health. She shared how her father had an undiagnosed mental health condition (bipolar disorder) which her family had to navigate as she grew up.

Her pocketbook for youth, Blessed Youth Survival Guide, is dedicated to Rev. Lund's 16 year old niece, Sydney, who sadly died by suicide in November 2020. It is her hope, and mine as well, that our churches can be safe and supportive faith communities for all families facing mental health issues.

Mental health matters. It is no surprise that the past two years have wreaked havoc on everyone's stress levels, and we have all needed to focus on self-care and resiliency. The question was asked, "What have we done as a church to promote mental health and spiritual care during this time?" I would love to hear your perspectives and learn what we are doing well, and what we can improve.

Our denomination offers resources and staff to assist congregations in addressing mental health issues within their communities. The United Church of Christ Mental Health Network is a ministry of our wider church that equips and supports churches for addressing mental health issues. (www.mhn-ucc.org)

The UCC Mental Health Network works to reduce stigma and promote the inclusion of people with mental illnesses/brain disorders and their families in the life, leadership and work of congregations. Together we envision a future in which people with mental illnesses feel welcomed, supported, valued and included in their congregations.

With a vision for greater mental health support in our churches, the Wisconsin Conference UCC has brought forth a resolution encouraging local churches to learn about becoming a W.I.S.E. congregation

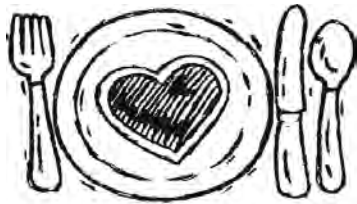
With the help of local churches addressing local community issues and state-wide issues, especially around mental health, we will have many more things to celebrate in the year to come.

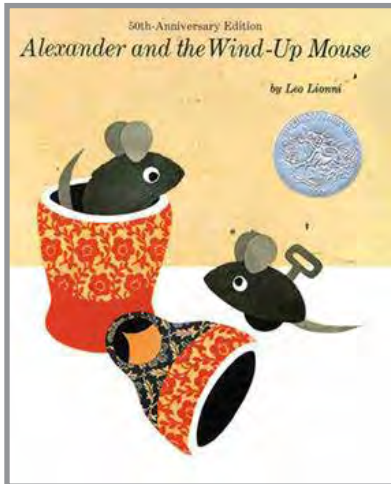

Summer Church School Continues — Grace in the Stories of Leo Lionni Children ages 3-11 are welcome to join Miss Jeanne and Miss Lydia for our Summer Church School program each Sunday. Following the Children's Moment in our Sunday Service, children come to the classrooms for storytime, music, and activities. Storytime will feature classic picturebooks by Leo Lionni and music will feature Old Testament songs. With each story, we are asking the question, "What is the grace in this story?" In this way, the children can begin to understand how

grace comes into our lives in our everyday activities and learning. After music time with Miss Lydia, children will go out to the playground, and they will join the grownups for coffee hour at the end of the church service.

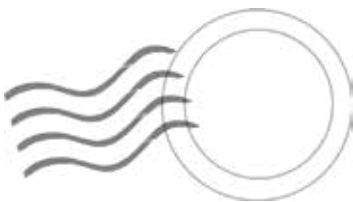
