Light, in Every Season

Beloved church,

On these October mornings the sun seems unrushed. It doesn't shout the way July sunlight does. It arrives with that late-autumn humility—angled, amber, a little thinner, content to slip through maple leaves and kitchen windows rather than blaze overhead. I've been noticing how the light changes us. Summer light makes us bold: doors flung open, schedules loosened, energy outward and everywhere. Autumn light feels like an invitation to pay attention—to the small, to the near at hand, to what is ripening and what is ready to be set down.

We sometimes talk about the "coming darkness" of winter as though it is all lack and loss. But Scripture's story of light is much more expansive than a contest the sun must win or lose. God's light doesn't compete with the seasons; it keeps finding us inside them. In summer, light dances. In winter, light listens. Summer light fuels. Winter light focuses. And in every season, God is not far off. "Even the darkness is not dark to you," the psalmist sings. Night itself "is as bright as the day" to the One who holds us (Psalm 139).

This November we begin our sermon series "Voices, Vantage, and Vision." It's a series about how God's light moves among us through time: the voices we inherit, the vantage we stand in now, and the vision we're becoming together. Each week we'll listen for the saints who carried light before us, we'll look with honesty at where we stand (our gifts and our gaps), and we'll ask God for sight—not floodlights, but the kind of lamp that guides the next faithful step.



Which brings me to an anniversary. In just a few weeks, First Congregational Church of Ripon turns 175. Think of that: 175 Advents of waiting light; 175 Easters of dawning light; 175 summers of bright, ordinary light on stone walls and wooden pews; 175 winters of softer light pooling across the sanctuary floor. We are part of a long procession of people who learned to love God and neighbor under the changing angles of the same Wisconsin sky. Our predecessors tended a flame

that did not belong to them; it belonged to God. They carried it through wars and pandemics, baptisms and funerals, boom times and lean ones, pastors coming and going, choirs swelling and quieting, roofs repaired and re-repaired.

Anniversaries ask us to remember and to re-member—to be knit back together. What are we holding from those 175 years that is worth carrying forward? A fierce welcome, the courage to ask hard questions, a commitment to justice and generosity, a sturdy tenderness for one another. What might God be asking us to set down, so that our hands are free for something new? Perhaps assumptions that no longer serve love. Perhaps fears that keep us from trying again. Perhaps the impatience that wants summer's pace even in winter's wisdom.

I also want to honor the gifts many of you are already bringing in this interim season: the committee meetings you attend after long workdays; the music you rehearse; the children you wrangle to Sunday School;

As we journey through "Voices, Vantage, and Vision" and turn toward our 175th Anniversary Sunday, I'm praying we'll let the season teach us. Let's receive the softer light as a teacher that slows us down enough to see—and to bless—what God is already illuminating in our life together. And when the first true wintry dusk settles before dinner, may we recognize it not as a threat but as a threshold. Between the already and the not-yet, God is here. Between what we remember and what we can't yet imagine, God is here. Between the saints we miss and the saints we're becoming, God is here.




November is kicking off Christmas Pageant and Church Anniversary preparations. Each week we are working towards crafts and projects to be used later in our craft store! Stay tuned!

Christmas Card treasures




What you need:
